Health and Social Care Revision

Dear Families,

I am writing to you because your child is working towards **their final exam on Friday 8 January 2027** for their BTEC Tech Award in Health and Social Care.

At this stage of the course, the key to achieving success is consistent, high-quality revision. Each week, all students complete structured retrieval practice at home using Carousel Learning. This revision is not optional, as it is a core part of how students consolidate their knowledge, and their understanding is assessed weekly through a test completed in lesson time. While these weekly quizzes are an important foundation, students should be revising beyond this to fully secure and deepen their understanding.

To achieve their full potential, students should be:

- Completing all Carousel Learning revision tasks carefully and regularly, ensuring they understand and can recall responses independently
- Using feedback from weekly tests to identify weaker areas and revisiting these promptly
- Revising frequently over time, rather than leaving revision until just before assessments

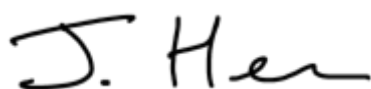
Successful students in Health and Social Care are those who can apply their knowledge to real situations, explain why things happen, and make clear, logical links between concepts such as life stages, factors affecting development, services, barriers, and person-centred care.

You can support your child by ensuring:

- Regular, distraction-free revision routines
- Talking through case studies aloud and explaining answers in full sentences
- The use of high-quality revision materials, such as the CGP Exam Practice Workbook for BTEC Tech Award in Health & Social Care (£7.00 on Amazon), which provides exam-style questions, guidance on different question types, and full mark schemes to support preparation for the Component 3 exam
- If they don't already have one, by purchasing a revision guide from school for £3.50 (cash only)
