Dangerous Parking and Driving on Trinity Road

Unfortunately, a number of parents / carers are putting lives at risk through a total disregard of safe driving and parking at the beginning and end of the school day. This has resulted, on occasions, in complete road blocks caused by cars being left in the middle of Trinity Road and on Laisteridge Lane whilst parents / carers collect and drop off students.

As a site serving over 600 students (at Dixons McMillan) and another 1200 at Dixons Trinity and Dixons Music, there are times where emergency services require access to the site to support our students with more complex needs. This is not possible when dangerous and careless parking is taking place, so please ensure that you only park in designated parking areas and do not double-park.

We would encourage families to report any obstructive parking to West Yorkshire Police who have the ability to deal with obstruction offences <https://www.westyorkshire.police.uk/form/report-obstructive-parking>. Parking contraventions are the responsibility of Bradford Council and we would encourage you to report contravening yellow lines / parking bays directly to the council <https://www.bradford.gov.uk/contact-us/contact-us-now/contact-us-now/>.

Finally, please ensure that the one-way system in operation on Trinity Road is adhered to at the start and end of the school day. This ensures that students and families can cross Trinity Road safely.

Parents / carers of students attending our school are encouraged to use the designated drop-off spot on Laisteridge Lane to avoid further issues on Trinity Road. If your child is old enough and responsible enough, we would also encourage you to park a street or two away, and allow them to walk to you, to ease the flow of traffic.
